5. Fortran Forum 85

Chris Lazou (ULCC), chief organiser of "Fortran Forum 85" which took place at the Institute of Education, London in July reported that the BCS Conference Section had not yet processed all the receipts but the likelihood was that our Group probably made a profit of between £500 - £1000. It was certainly successful in terms of numbers with about 130 - 140 attending. The visiting X3J3 speakers were very pleased with the Forum, indicating that it was the liveliest and most thought-provoking of the various "Fortran Forums" which had been arranged at different locations in the USA and Europe over the last year or so.

The BCS Fortran Specialist Group committee apologise to all attendees on the quality of the accommodation, which was very substandard. It was assumed we would be allocated a much better room at the Institute like at the previous Forum. Nor was the buffet up to our expectations. But we did have a problem in that we only had about 30 bookings a few weeks before the event with a last minute rush which we could not anticipate.

Hopefully the final "8X" draft will be available early next year and a Forum would provide everyone ideal opportunity to hear, comment on and influence its content. Therefore it is the intention of your committee to organise such an event. This time we promise you a superior venue and an excellent lunch. (As a wine enthusiast I shall personally choose this item!) We will advertise this event in the new year. We hope to bring some ANSI representatives across the Atlantic specially for it.
